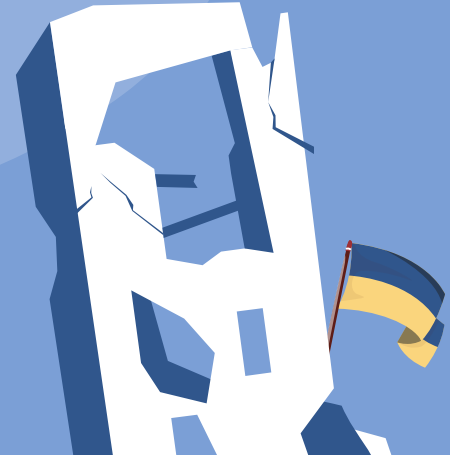

LOSS OF ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE

Each of the branches of the energy system suffered large losses:

- occupied or captured 90% of wind and 30% of solar power plants, more than 30% of cogeneration plants;
- occupied Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant;
- Severodonetsk, Okhtyrsk, Kremenchuk, Chernihiv thermal power plants, as well as thermal power plants in Dnipropetrovsk, Donetsk, Kharkiv regions, Sumy, Mykolaiv were damaged.

WEATHER CONDITIONS

According to the Ukrainian Hydrometeorological Center, the first frosts will occur in October. In December 2022, the temperature in some places will drop to -10 - -15 , in January 2023 it is forecasted to -15 - -20 . The average temperature is $+3$ - -2 degrees Celsius

ASSISTANCE FORM



Individual means of heating - sleeping bags, thermal blankets, cloak - tents, etc.



Electric heating devices - heat fans, oil heaters, micathermic and infrared heaters



Solid fuel stoves for heating and cooking for private households



Modular boiler stations are designed for autonomous central heating and hot water supply of multi-apartment residential buildings

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Period	August 2022 - March 2023
Regions of Ukraine	Kharkiv, Chernihiv, Kyiv, Mykolaiv, Sumy, Zaporizhia regions - regions with the largest area of destruction; Dnipropetrovsk, Lviv, and Ivano-Frankivsk regions - centers for refugees.
Recipients of assistance	Individuals who lived in damaged or destroyed housing as a result of Russian aggression; legal entities - housing cooperative, hospitals, centers for internally displaced persons
Assistance form	In natural form
Required resources	Humanitarian aid, financing for the purchase of heating equipment/materials for production
